The Lord's Supper: Our Understanding and Practice

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who are members of a different church other than The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor. ALL SAINTS' DAY

TODAY is "All Saints' Day". The word "saint" is from the Latin word sanctus and means "holy", and it means that you have been "set apart" to live a godly life. The Bible teaches us that a "saint" is one made "holy" and "set apart" through faith in Jesus Christ (see 1 Corinthians 1:2 for one of many examples). On All Saints' Day, we especially remember and thank God for those "saints" who have died in the faith and whom we look forward to seeing in the Kingdom of Heaven. As Lutheran Christians, we would never pray to, or worship, the "saints" in any way, because we pray to and worship only the One, True and Only God, the Holy Trinity. Rather, we show the saints honor in three ways: 1) We thank God for their faith and life. 2) We see how God kept His promises to them and remember that He will keep His promises to us also. 3) We learn from their faith and life and are encouraged to live godly lives ourselves. The saints are a "great cloud of witnesses (Hebrews 12:1)" who surround us and motivate us to live holy lives.

Dear Friends and Family.

Happy 500th anniversary of the Reformation! I love this time in the church year because it puts in high focus the extreme grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Of course this is always the focus, but at certain times in the year it is somehow highlighted to a greater degree: Christmas, Easter, Reformation Sunday, etc. We remember how God enabled a humble Martin Luther to help fight the slavery the leaders of the church inflicted on it's people, slavery to the law, sin, and good works. God used this man to redirect the church back to The Man, Jesus Christ, who brought us from the slavery of sin and the curse of the law to the freedom of the Gospel. Martin fought to bring the church back to this truth, so that we can live by faith in Jesus and His Gospel and follow the law, not to earn our place in heaven but to live according to our new life in Christ.

One of the great tools Martin used to spread the Gospel was translating the Bible into the language of the common German man and woman. The world forever changed. I am so grateful to be a small part in this great ministry, the ministry of Bible Translation.
