The Scripture Lessons Philippians 2:1-11

¹ If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, ² then make my joy complete by

being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. ³ Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. ⁴ Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.

⁵ Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: ⁶ Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, ⁷ but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death – even death on a cross! ⁹ Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Hebrews 1:1-14

- ¹ In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. ³ The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. ⁴ So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs.
- ⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father "? Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? ⁶ And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him."
- ⁷ In speaking of the angels he says, "He makes his angels winds, his servants flames of fire." ⁸ But about the Son he says, "Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever, and righteousness will be the scepter of your kingdom. ⁹ You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy."
- ¹⁰ He also says, "In the beginning, O Lord, you laid the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. ¹¹ They will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment. ¹² You will roll them up like a robe; like a garment they will be changed. But you remain the same, and your years will never end."
- ¹³ To which of the angels did God ever say, "Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet"? ¹⁴ Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?

The Apostles' Creed



Christ Over All

Summer Series on the Book of Hebrews
Philippians 2:1-11 Hebrews 1:1-14

Do you remember some of the great Old Testament prophets?

- + Moses who let the Israelites out of Egypt in the great Exodus story, and who spoke face-to-face with God
- + Elijah, the bold prophet who called fire down from heaven and killed the prophets of Baal
- + Jonah, the reluctant prophet, who was swallowed by a whale and sent to Nineveh, the most wicked city on earth
- + Daniel, the prophet in Exile who was given a position of authority in the Babylonian kingdom
- + Malachi, the last prophet to speak in Old Testament times

Do you remember some of these prophets and their stories? This isn't even all of them! We could talk about Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Amos, Hosea, Zechariah, Joel, Samuel, and many more!

The book of Hebrews begins by **remembering** these prophets; and then **pivoting** to Christ as the Last Great Prophet who speaks for God.

In the past God <u>spoke</u> to our forefathers through the **Prophets** at many times and in various ways, but in these Last Days He has <u>spoken</u> to us by **His Son** Hebrews 1:1-2

Today we are beginning a summer series on the Book of Hebrews and the great truths that it teaches to us. The Book of Hebrews begins with one of the most grand & majestic descriptions of Christ in all the Bible1! There are **10 different descriptions** of Christ and His work in the first four verses alone!

¹ Hebrews 1:1-4 is <u>one</u> sentence in the original Greek, 73 words long! It is high Christology as we learn about Jesus' divinity as Creator, His Incarnation, His atonement, and His exaltation!

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these Last Days He has **spoken to us by his Son**, whom He appointed the **Heir of all things**, through Whom also He **created the world**. He is the Radiance of the glory of God and the **exact imprint of His nature**, and He **upholds the universe** by the Word of His power. After making **purification for sins**, He **sat down at the right hand** of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as **the Name He has inherited** is more excellent than theirs. Hebrews 1:1-4

There are **10 different descriptions** of Christ and His work in these four verses alone! This morning let's take a look at two of them.

The first is that God no longer speaks to us through Prophets, but through His Son. Jesus is the Last Great Prophet who speaks for God2. The Son of God speaks on behalf of God the Father; Jesus teaches us everything we need to know for salvation and sanctification; His powerful Word creates our faith and sustains our faith. Jesus is the "Word made flesh" who reveals God's love and grace and mercy to us. He shows us the Father; and in Him, we hear the Father's Word.

A Prophet spoke for God; The Son speaks AS God!

WORDS; we are to abide in HIS WORDS; we are to grow in our knowledge of HIS WORDS; we are to put HIS WORDS into practice in our lives. HIS WORDS are a lamp for our feet and light for our path; HIS WORDS are God's Words; they are the most important words that you will ever hear. That is why it's so important to be biblically literate and doctrinally sound — there is nothing more important than knowing, understanding, and obeying the Words of Jesus!

² One clear mark of a false teacher is that God <u>continues</u> to speak "*in many and various ways*" outside of Scripture. This is exactly opposite what Hebrews 1:1-2 says! And, the false doctrine they teach always comes from this "continual speaking" they claim from God.

Jesus the Son of God is also the One who has made purification for sins.

After He had made purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. Hebrews 1:3b

That word purification is the idea of cleansing — it is an Old Testament worship word where the blood of a sacrifice cleanses people from their sins. The Old Testament sacrifices were all foreshadows of Christ's great sacrifice on the cross. Every Old Testament sacrifice pointed forward to Jesus and His once and for all sacrifice on the cross. His once and for all sacrifice purifies us from our sin. We are cleansed, we are forgiven, we are declared righteous, we are considered holy in God's eyes. You have been purified from your sin; every single sin you have committed is forgiven in Christ, the Son of God.

This purification that Jesus made on the cross is our comfort and strength. As baptized disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ, we do not live in guilt, but we live in grace. Your sin has been removed from you; it is been placed on Christ when He died on the cross; you are clean because of Christ! You have peace with God through the Lord Jesus Christ! He has made purification for your sins3.

Take another look at this verse in Hebrews:

After He had made purification for sins, **He sat down at the right hand of the majesty in heaven.** Hebrews 1:3b

Remember that the "right hand of the Majesty in Heaven" is a figure of speech, it is not a literal location which Christ is confined to. It is a way to speak about the power and authority of the Risen Christ. It's a way of talking about Jesus being all-powerful, all-knowing, and everywhere. He is

³ This is the **major theme** in the Book of Hebrews. Christ is our Great High Priest who has sacrificed Himself --> He made purification for our sins through His death on the cross. The Book of Hebrews has *much more* to say about this! This focus on Christ and His cross is what makes the Book of Hebrews so high and wide and long and deep! Through the summer sermon series, we will explore the many ways this theme is brought out to us in the Book of Hebrews.

at work *in all things* for the benefit of His Church and for the good of His People.

With this phrase, the Book of Hebrews reminds us of the Ascension of Christ and the giving of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

The Son of God, the Last Great Prophet who speaks for God, and the One who made purification for your sins, is the Ascended Lord who is present in your life, with His

mighty power, making everything that happens in your life work for your benefit and for your good.

In addition, as the All-Powerful Ascended Lord, Jesus has sent the Holy Spirit to you, just as He promised. The Holy Spirit lives within you; nourishes, sustains, and strengthens your faith through the Word and the Sacraments. The Holy Spirit comes alongside of you as your "Advocate"; He is your Divine companion, comforter, helper, and defender. The Holy Spirit sanctifies you and set you apart to live a strong Christian life and to hold to the truth of God's Holy Word!

What a blessing for us! Not only has Christ made purification for our sins, but He also has sat down at the right hand of the majesty in heaven!

Today is we get started on our summer series in the book of Hebrews, spend some time reading and meditating on Hebrews chapter 1. It's a fascinating chapter that begins with **10 different descriptions4** of Christ and His work for us and our salvation!

⁴ Try this tonight: Start your prayer like this: Heavenly Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit, I pray in the Name of Jesus, who is the Last, Great Prophet, Your Son, the Heir of all things, the Maker of the universe, the radiance of Your glory, the exact representation of Your being, the Sustainer of all things, the Purificator of sins, the One who sits at Your right hand, the One who has a superior Name...
