

Thanksgiving 2020

Habakkuk 3:17-19 Psalm 100 Luke 17:11-19 November 25, 2020 Pastor Dave Bolte

This is certainly been one of the most unique years that any of us have ever seen.

Covid has interrupted our lives in many ways:

- ⇒ We can't go anywhere without a mask or face covering
- ⇒ We are suspicious of anyone who sneezes or coughs
- ⇒ We have anxiety about getting the virus; and if we get it, how serious will it affect us?
- ⇒ Our favorite restaurants have been shut down or relegated to carry-out only
- ⇒ We have family members and beloved friends in nursing homes that have been in lockdown and virtual prison for the last 9 months
- ⇒ Worship has been curtailed; some churches remain closed
- ⇒ Much of School has been online classes; and even now, kids on campus need to wear masks during the day
- ⇒ Travel has been restricted
- ⇒ Vacation plans have been scrapped

⇒ If you get too close to someone and they end up with Covid, you are in a **14 day timeout**, *or should I say "quarantine"*

Covid has interrupted our lives in many ways!

In some ways,

we might feel like Habakkuk in the Old Testament times.

He was living at the end of Judah's history; perhaps around 600BC.

It looked like the powerful Babylonians were coming to destroy Judah; and indeed, they did come.

They would sweep through Israel, capture Jerusalem, and exile the people.

It was bleak, their lives were interrupted and changed forever.

Habakkuk the prophet describes it like this:

The fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines,

the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls HABAKKUK 3:17

THAT'S BLEAK.

Maybe you are feeling like that this year . . .

- maybe tonight you are sick and tired of Covid
- o maybe it has been a tough year for you;
- o maybe you are feeling worn out and fatigued;
- o maybe your heart is weary, worried, or stressed;
- o maybe your spirit is beaten down or depressed;

Maybe you are not feeling very thankful tonight.

The evil in our country; the controversial election; trouble at work, difficulties in your vocations; issues in your home; health changes, or problems with relationships --- they all can make you <u>not feeling</u> very thankful.

One of the things that THANSKGIVING does is that it REMINDS US to look beyond the stress in our lives,

and see God's good hand in it all.

God is greater than our problems; our troubles come and go, but the Lord remains forever.

A Godly, Biblical perspective is invaluable.

The world changes; but the Lord remains faithful, steadfast, and unchangeable.

Even Covid will die out, and life will get back to normal.

Nothing that happens in this world; Or in this country Or in your life can ever change God's promises.

He remains in full control over all things. He remains loving, kind, and good to you.

He is Your Father,

who watches over every detail of your life, and promises to use His mighty power for your good

He is Your Savior,

who has taken your sin and guilt

upon Himself, and He carried them through death and into a grave, so that they would never ever be seen again.

He is Your Comforter,

who comes alongside of you to strengthen you and bring stability to you through God's Word an Promises.

God is greater than our problems; our troubles come and go, but the Lord remains forever.

Habakkuk understood this, and that was his message to the people of Judah.

The inspired prophet wrote:

I will rejoice in the LORD,
I will be joyful in God my Savior.
The Sovereign LORD is my strength;
He makes my feet like the feet of a deer,
He enables me to tread on the heights.
HABAKKUK 3:18-19

You are free to rejoice in the Lord and be Joyful in God your Savior!

You are not a slave to the world nor your problems!

You have been set free in Christ!

What is true for Habakkuk and the Israelites is true for you as well!
