ALL IDOLS AND FALSE GODS ARE DEMONS.

I know that is a **bold statement** that might catch you off guard. But it's true. All idols and false gods are demonic. There is no such thing as "other gods". It is not like there is a pantheon of gods and as Christians we follow the one called the "Holy Trinity." There are no other gods. The New Testament teaches us that anything that is called a "god" or an "idol" is really a **demon**.

The sacrifices to pagan gods are offered to <u>demons</u>, not to God

1 Corinthians 10:20

The Bible condemns false gods and idolatry in the First Commandment, "You shall have no other gods before me." The Bible has only harsh words of condemnation for idols and idolatry; and at the same time, the Holy Scriptures reveal that the One, True and Only God is the Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the God of Creation, Salvation, and Sanctification.

The Holy Trinity reveals Himself to us in Holy Scripture. In fact, the first verse of the Bible teaches it to us. Genesis 1:1 says, In the Beginning, God created the Heavens and the earth. There are two fascinating things at work in this passage that teaches us WHO God is.

- ⇒ The word "God" is plural, indicating the "three-ness" of God
- ⇒ The verb "created" is singular, indicating the "one-ness" of God

Later, as Scripture unfolds, we learn that there are 3 Persons, 1 God: God is "Triune": 3 in 1. God is the Holy "Trinity"

The very first verse in the Bible begins to teach us about **Who God is!**

Ultimately, it is Jesus Himself Who reveals God fully to us. In the Great Commission, Jesus teaches us that there is One God in Three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19).

For most of history, people didn't have Bibles so readily available like we have them today. So "Creeds" were developed to help teach people about God, and to help them understand the Holy Trinity. Two of those creeds we use weekly and frequently: The Apostle's Creed and The Nicene Creed.

But there is another Creed, seldom used because of its length, called the **Athanasian Creed**. The Athanasian Creed really focuses on teaching us about Who God is. Let's take a closer look at this Creed today. Please take out the handout called "The Athanasian Creed".

Let's read the "first part: The Holy Trinity" responsively. -->

This part of the Creed talks about WHO GOD IS: it helps us understand the Holy Trinity.

The Athanasian Creed Part 1 --> The Holy Trinity Whosoever will be saved, before all things it is necessary that he hold the [Christian] faith. People: Which faith except everyone do keep whole and undefiled, without doubt he shall perish Everlastingly. Pastor: And the [Christian] faith is this: People: That we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity, neither confounding the persons, nor dividing the substance Pastor: For there is one Person of the Father, another of the Son, and another of the Holy Spirit. People: But the godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, is all one, the glory equal, the majesty co-eternal. Pastor: Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit. People: The Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, and the Holy Spirit uncreated. Pastor: The Father incomprehensible, the Son incomprehensible, and the Holy Spirit incomprehensible. The Father eternal, the Son eternal, and the Holy Spirit eternal. So that in all things, as is aforesaid. Pastor: the Unity in Trinity and the Trinity in Unity is to be worshipped. He therefore that will be People:

saved is compelled thus to think of the Trinity.

At first, this creed sounds wordy. But remember that it is a teaching tool that millions of Christians throughout history have used, even memorized, so that they could learn Who God is. Even though they did not have personal Bibles --> they could memorize creeds.

One of the strengths of this Creed is the Definition and Distinction style and format at work in the Creed. Here is a sample:

So the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Ghost is God. <-- DEFINITION And yet they are not three Gods, but one God. <-- DISTINCTION

"Definition and Distinction" means that you define the truth, and then clarify it by making distinctions.

"Definition and Distinction" is a good way to think about your own faith and beliefs, especially in light of the deteriorating state of the Christian church and the depraved world we live in. It is important to **clarify** what you believe and what your convictions are based on God's Holy Word, and then think through the **distinctions**, those things that you do *not* believe and you know to be *false and contrary* to God's Holy Word.

For instance, every "Christian" will say they love Jesus. But what Jesus are they talking about? You have to make distinctions:

- **†** The "Jesus" who <u>neve</u>r worked miracles <u>nor</u> rose from the dead?
- **†** The "Jesus" who was only a good man and only a role model for us
- **†** The "Jesus" who motivates you to be the "best person you can be"?
- **†** The "Jesus" who loves everyone, who is tolerant, and loves diversity, and would <u>never condemn sin</u> or offend you or ask you to repent?
- **†** The Jesus who's primary concern is that you are "healthy and wealthy"?
- **†** Or as we believe, the "Jesus" who's death, burial and resurrection brings repentance and the forgiveness of sin to all people?

"Definition and Distinction" helps you sort through the lies and the false teachings in "Christianity" today. It also helps you in sorting through the moral issues that we face each day. It is also a good way to think about your own faith and beliefs. "Definition and Distinction" means that you define the truth of Holy Scripture, and then clarify it by making distinctions of what you do not believe.

When it comes to the Holy Trinity, the Bible maintains two truths about God: The one-ness of God, there is **One God**; and at the same time, the three-ness of God: there are **Three Persons**. The mystery of God is that He is 3 and 1 at the same time.

A proper understanding of the Holy Trinity will lead to a proper understanding of **WHO JESUS IS**. That is the second part of the Athanasian Creed. The second part of the Athanasian Creed focuses on **WHO** Jesus is, and **WHAT** He has done for us. This is a clear confession of the gospel of salvation in Christ alone. *Please*

take out the handout called "The Athanasian Creed" again. This time, let's read the backside that says "Part 2: The Son of God" responsively.

The second part of the Athanasian Creed focuses on WHO Jesus is, and WHAT He has done for us. It clearly teaches the Gospel to us.

It teaches us that God Himself is our Savior who has come into our world to do the work of salvation for us! The Lord Jesus, Son of God and Son of Mary, gives us the gifts of salvation through His suffering, death and resurrection.

The Athanasian Creed Part 2 --> The Son of God

- P: Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation that he also believe rightly the Incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- C: For the right faith is, that we believe and confess, that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is God and man;
- P: God, of the substance of the Father, begotten before the worlds;
- C: and man of the substance of his mother, born in the world;
- P: perfect God and perfect man,
- C: of a rational soul and human flesh subsisting.
- P: Equal to the Father, as touching His godhead;
- C: and inferior to the Father, as touching His manhood;
- P: who, although He is God and man, yet he is not two, but one Christ;
- C: one, not by conversion of the godhead into flesh but by taking of the manhood into God;
- P: one altogether; not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.
- C: For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ;
- P: who suffered for our salvation,
- C: descended into hell,
- P: rose again the third day from the dead.
- C: He ascended into heaven,
- P: He sits at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the quick and the dead.
- C: At His coming all men will rise again with their bodies and shall give account for their own works.
- P: And they that have done good shall go into life everlasting;
- C: and they that have done evil into everlasting fire.
- P: This is the [Christian] faith, which except a man believe faithfully, he cannot be saved.
- C: AMEN!

The Creeds teach us WHO GOD IS and WHAT HE HAS DONE FOR US!

Because we have Bibles everywhere today, creeds are not as important as they once were.

- But they still stand as clear witnesses than define the truth of God's Holy
 Word and makes important distinctions between false teachers
- They still teach the faithful, including us today, about Who God is and what He has done for us in His Son Jesus Christ
- And the Creeds connect us to Christians throughout history who have used the same words to confess WHO GOD IS and WHAT HE HAS DONE FOR US!

On this Holy Trinity Sunday, we thank God that He has revealed Himself to us through His Word, and that we can confess our faith in Creeds.
